Andrea also liked feeding the ducks at the duck pond.




They both like to go outdoors as a hobby and Samntha likes making Macaroni and Cheese for the house with Staff.

REPORT A REPAIR

Reporting a repair or complaint is important, and we want to make it easy for everyone, including tenants with a learning disability.

If you need to report a problem or concern, you can find a special code on the van that should be in your home. It's called a QR code.

To scan it, you can use your smartphone or tablet. Open the camera app on your device and point it at the QR code. Make sure the whole code is visible on your screen.

Your device will automatically recognise the code and show you some options. Tap on the option that says 'Open' or 'Go to Website.' This will take you to a form where you can report your repair or complaint. You can also attach photos of the issue for FCHA to understand what help you need fast.

If you need any help, don't hesitate to ask someone you trust.



He liked the sensors and the lady gave him a free one.


He said he would like to go again and stop a bit longer.

Janet and Eira from Neath Port Talbot went to Pendine with staff for a holiday over the summer.










They loved being out and about visiting shops and going to the beach and eating food.

Bobby has booked in a holiday to Harry Potter World! He also loves making sandwiches and looking for bugs.






Sasha likes to cook and do art at her grandparents.

For me, it is knowing that if anything goes wrong or stops working, help is a phone call away and that it is not all on my shoulders to fix.


PG'S TIPS



I'm Phil, a Technical Officer at FCHA and this Newsletter I want to let you know about Solar Panels. You may see more solar panels at properties in your home.

How does a PV cell work?

PV cells are panels you can attach to your roof or walls. Each cell is made from one or two layers of semi conducting material, usually silicon. When light shines on the cell it creates an electric field across the layers. The stronger the sunshine, the more electricity is produced.



PV cells come in a variety of shapes and colours, from grey "solar tiles" that look like roof tiles to panels and transparent cells that you can use on conservatories and glass.

A garden in Wrexham has had a revamp after funding from WCBC who bought the picnic table/ bench and an application to FCHA community involvement grant for a shed and garden tools.








In June, tenants and staff (FCHA and support staff) joined together to help tidy the garden, and build the shed.

AUTUMN RECIPE

- 3 tbsp olive oil, plus an extra drizzle (optional)
- · 8 large pork sausages
- · I onion, finely sliced
- · sprinkle of golden caster sugar
- · I tosp red wine vinegar
- · I tbsp tomato purée
- I/2 tsp smoked paprika
- 400g can chopped tomatoes
- I00ml red wine
- · 2 bay leaves
- 400g can butter beans, drained but not rinsed

For the crumb topping (optional)

- 50g fresh breadcrumbs
- · 2 garlic cloves, finely grated
- handful of parsley leaves, roughly chopped





ONE POT SAUSAGE CASSEROLE

Method

STEP I

Heat the oven to 220C/200C fan/gas 7. Heat I tbsp of the oil in a shallow ovenproof casserole over a medium heat and gently fry the sausages for 5-8 mins, or until brown on all sides.

Transfer to a plate using tongs. Tip the onions into the pan and fry for 5-8 mins until beginning to turn golden. Drizzle in a little more oil if the onions start to stick.

Sprinkle in the sugar and cook for a minute before stirring in the vinegar, tomato purée and paprika to form a paste. Tip in the tomatoes, then pour the wine into the tomato can, swish it round, and add to the pan.

Stir in the bay leaves and beans, then arrange the sausages on top so they're half-submerged in the sauce but still a little exposed.

STEP 2

Bring the mixture to a simmer, then bake in the oven for 20 mins. Meanwhile, make the topping.

Mix the breadcrumbs with the garlic and parsley, then season and stir in I tbsp oil.

Scatter the topping over the casserole, then drizzle with the remaining I tbsp oil and bake for IO mins more until the breadcrumbs are golden and crisp.

Leave to stand for a few minutes, then take to the table and serve from the dish.
