It was very exciting and when my boyfriend got down on one knee and said "Will you marry me?" I said yes because I love him so much.




We got engaged in Wednesday Club before it closed down.

ALLEN'S TOUCH SCREEN



Allen from Swansea has a diagnosis of Dementia and in the last 6 months has been less engaged in activities. His pace of life is relaxed and needs to be predictable to support his wellbeing. As a team dimensions started to explore specialist activities and equipment that Allen could do that he may enjoy. Their wish list was something that helped with the things Allen needed and the things he enjoyed which included:

- Relaxation
- Music
- Memory games and other activities
- · Touch screen, sturdy and height adjustable
- Communication aids
- · Reminiscence tours and apps

They came across a company called Inspired inspirations that produce touch screen activity tables for adults with Dementia.

The screen was 39 inches in size and on a height adjustable table.



This was ideal as Allen

has scoliosis and it could be adjusted to eye level based on how he was seated. He seemed to respond better to close up activities than his TV for instance. The activity table met all of the things on their wish list and more.

ALLEN'S TOUCH SCREEN

Dimensions met with Allen's care manager and appointee and decided that the benefits could outweigh the cons and it was worth trying the touch screen. They felt the size of the screen was important as Allen hasn't engaged with iPad and laptops previously very well.



The screen is height adjustable and tilts for good positioning. It can go flat for instance to play a piano app. It also has toughened glass.



The table was ordered and delivered quickly at the end of July and although they are still exploring its full functions they can already see improved engagement and interest from Allen.

He has started singing to songs which they have not heard him do for some time and engaging with the touch screen activities. Allen finds watching the fish relaxing and is less agitated when sitting now

CHURCH LAND CONVERSION

FCHA is thrilled to share the news that we have joined forces with fellow South Wales housing associations to form a new team which will be working alongside Housing Justice Cymru to transform old church land into new affordable rented housing.







This is a before and after of some church land that was changed into housing for people in need.

It is hoped that this new partnership will greatly increase the number of affordable homes being built through the charity's national project, 'Faith in Affordable Housing', which sees a lot of church land and buildings transformed into affordable rented housing. To date the programme has delivered almost 100 affordable homes across Wales.

Bishop John Davies said, "Everyone deserves a decent home that meets their needs, and we hope this next phase of the programme will produce more homes for the people most in the need."

TECH TIPS

The technical services team have an announcement if you have large work done in your Kitchen or Bathroom.



As you may be aware First Choice completes regular refurbishments at its properties on items such as kitchens and bathrooms. Whilst the improvement work is a benefit. Such refurbishments can restrict access to the facilities during these works. For example, in some circumstances tenants may not be able to access a shower or kitchen for an over week, often this means First Choice tenants may need to leave the property and find alternative accommodation that meets their needs. This is very often challenging for tenants and support staff having to leave their home.

TEMP KITCHENS & BATHROOMS

First Choice has recently been trailing a Temporary Kitchen Pod at one of its properties with success.



First Choice have now found an alternative to tenants leaving their homes during bathroom and kitchen refurbishments. Temporary Kitchen and Bathroom pods by The Temporary Solutions Group, provide Kitchen and Bathroom pods that can be placed on the drive of the property. These pods come with an array of options.

This provides a successful alternative to tenants who would normally struggle to decant properties during kitchen and bathroom refurbishments.



INSIGHT

Innovate Trust support lots of First Choice tenants across South Wales. They have developed an app called Insight which you can use on your smart phone or tablet. The app includes many features for users - from a wider community group where individuals can communicate with each other and share how they spend their time, to a private digital diary for each user that can only be seen by those who have been granted access, such as close friends, family and support workers.





Around 40 activities have been put online each week for people to help people connect. Innovate Trust run a weekly advice surgery to help people to use the app and get support if they get stuck. The want other organisations to work together and share their activities to create a large calendar of choices. They have already connected with other organisations that are part of the 'neighbourhood'. This includes First Choice, Learning Disability Wales, Gig Buddies, Cardiff People First, Vale People First, RCT People First, Spectacle Theatre, and Electric Umbrella.

INSIGHT

There are now more than 500 people using the app. People are enjoying the activities and some people are taking part in activities for the first time. Some people are getting involved who wouldn't normally attend real life meet-ups due to lack of confidence or lack of support or time to attend. They can now do them virtually. People have more control and are more independent

COVID ANXIETY



Are you feeling worried about leaving the house because of COVID-I9? These 5 tips might help.

We have all spent a lot of time at home and away from other people because of COVID-I9.

We are allowed to do more now and see people but it is okay if this feels scary sometimes.

I) Take your time.

You do not have to rush or do too much.
Set yourself little goals that you feel comfortable with, like going for a walk or meeting a friend for a coffee.
A good tip is to focus on today. Try not to worry about tomorrow or next week.



2) What are the rules?

We hear a lot about COVID-I9 and this can get confusing. You can check a website like GOV.UK or the NHS but sometimes it is best to ask someone you trust for help.



3) Prepare for an outing.

Check that you feel happy with the plans and try to think of all the good bits too.

Are you going somewhere you enjoy with people you feel comfortable with?



4) Make time to relax.

Doing the things we could not do before is exciting but it can also be tiring.

Make sure you take breaks. People do different things to relax, like listening to music, being outside, or drawing.



5) Speak to someone about your thoughts.

Talking to someone you feel safe with is a good idea. It can help you feel happier and remind you that you are not alone.

Talking about how you feel means other people can understand you better so they can do the right things to help you.



FREE LAPTOPS AND TABLETS!

FCHA, in partnership with Digital Communities Wales (DCW) have had the fantastic opportunity to give I90 iPads, tablets and laptops to tenants across Wales.

Everyone receiving a device has been asked to complete a survey measuring their access to online activities and to tell us how these activities have benefitted their health and wellbeing.

HALLOWEEN COLOURING



AUTUMN RECIPE

- · 2 cooking apples, peeled, cored and cut into small pieces
- 50g golden caster sugar150g blackberries
- · I tbsp cornflour
- · I tbsp honey
- · I tsp cinnamon
- · 2 x 320g shortcrust pastry sheets
- · legg, beaten
- · I tbsp white caster sugar
- custard, to serve (optional)



SPICED APPLE AND BLACKBERRY HAND PIES

Method

- I. Put the apples and golden caster sugar in a saucepan with 2 tbsp water and cook, covered, for 6 mins or until the apples are soft, stirring once or twice.
- 2. Tip the mixture into a shallow dish and spread out to cool slightly, then tip in the blackberries and stir. In a separate bowl, mix the cornflour with the honey and cinnamon, then stir it into the fruit mixture.
- 3. Unroll the pastry sheets and, using a l0cm round cutter, cut out l2 circles. Spoon the fruit filling onto half of the pastry circles, leaving a border of about lcm around the edge. Brush the beaten egg around the edges and place a plain pastry disc on top to encase the filling, then make a little dent in the top and bottom to form an apple shape. Seal the edges all the way around using the prongs of a fork, then brush with egg.
- 4. Use the pastry off-cuts to cut out little leaf shapes and stalks, then stick them on with beaten egg. Poke a steam hole in the top with a skewer. Repeat with the remaining pastry and filling. Arrange the pies on a baking sheet lined with baking parchment and chill for at least 30 mins, or up to 24 hrs. Can be frozen unbaked for up to 2 months.
- 5. Heat oven to 200C/I80C fan/gas 6. Bake the pies for 20 mins, or until the pastry is golden and the filling is bubbling through the hole. If cooking from frozen, bake for an extra 5 mins. Sprinkle with the sugar, then leave to cool for at least 20 mins before serving with custard.


